Dear Christian Friends,

Greetings in Christ from Kenya! In Africa, millions of people have professed faith in Christ, but most of them have never been taught or been disciplined. They have not been taught because the “laborers are few.” At this point, Biblical Training for church leaders is the greatest need of churches in East Africa.

This is why Trinity Biblical Institute is a necessity. TBI is designed to prepare servant-leaders for ministry by training them in 16 different areas over a four year period.

We praise God for tremendous progress. Last week I met with students from six African countries that desire to help us. Then I met with leaders from South Sudan and made plans to open a branch of TBI in Juba, South Sudan this coming April; we were told to expect 600 students. Today I met with 44 pastors and church leaders in Kenya, who want to help us start our fourth Branch of TBI.



In just four months I believe that we will have four branches of TBI with a total of 1700 students! God is on the move! Last Sunday four of our students

were ordained as Church leaders; these men have already started a new church! Tomorrow I preach to seven of our churches back in Uganda at a joint rally. Never have I seen such progress.

As we go forward to the nations of East Africa, we need a central headquarters with a training facility large enough for 500 students at one time and accommodations for our faculty. Through a generous gift, we have been able to buy more land and now TCWM owns five strategically located acres; we purchased the top of a mountain. Next week we break ground on our International Headquarters in Kapchorwa, Uganda. Here we will establish the main campus of our college and eventually direct the work in six other branches. The campus will



include a guest house for our faculty from the US and Africa, a large pavilion and Christian library. These facilities will also be used for TCWM offices, a study center, the training of church officers, discipleship, retreats, TBI classes, and specialized classes for pastors, women's ministry and microfinance.

Once this facility is firmly established and staffed, we plan in the next 9 years to open additional branches of TBI in Burundi, Tanzania, Ethiopia, and Rwanda. We already have contacts in each of these countries who desire to go forward with us.

As the year comes to a close, we need your help. We hope to finish the main building on our new campus by this April. Eleven of our students now desire to go for advanced training at Westminster Christian Institute in Uganda. God has already provided the land, funds for a wall around the compound, extra funds to purchase a total of five acres, and to begin the building. The total cost of this campus is \$185,000. The donor of our matching fund has now promised a total of \$65,000. Our additional need is \$120,000. Could you help us with a year-end gift at this strategic time to complete these facilities?
