What is important to you?

“I am wired by nature to love the same toys that the world loves. I start to fit in. I start to love what others love. I start to call earth "home." Before you know it, I am calling luxuries "needs" and using my money just the way unbelievers do. I begin to forget the war. I don't think much about people perishing. Missions and unreached people drop out of my mind. I stop dreaming about the triumphs of grace. I sink into a secular mind-set that looks first to what man can do, not what God can do. It is a terrible sickness. And I thank God for those who have forced me again and again toward a wartime mind-set.”

“God is pursuing with omnipotent passion a worldwide purpose of gathering joyful worshipers for Himself from every tribe and tongue and people and nation. He has an inexhaustible enthusiasm for the supremacy of His name among the nations. Therefore, let us bring our affections into line with His, and, for the sake of His name, let us renounce the quest for worldly comforts and join His global purpose.”


These quotes, from John Piper, remind us that our real home is heaven; here on earth we are part of the church militant; we are more than conquerors, lifting up the name of Christ to the nations.

Trinity Center for World Mission, is in the midst of this conflict. We are training soldiers for the King, servant leaders for His Great and Eternal Kingdom.

We are very close to great victories on several fronts: Our students are growing in their understanding of the Word of God. Our faculty has grown to 20 African teachers. In July, for the first time we plan to establish a branch of Trinity Biblical Institute in Kigale, Rwanda. We are taking the Gospel to the nations, going from country to country in order to make disciples.

These activities are the heart of TBI and where most of our pledged support goes. However, **now we have an opportunity to complete the auditorium at our main campus in Kapchorwa**, We have made great progress on this building.





This building includes a large auditorium that will hold almost 700 students. **This building will be used to train future Christian leaders in East and Central Africa.** It will be the home base for Trinity Biblical Institute—Kapchorwa, Uganda. It will serve as a place for students from war torn areas to study. It will provide the main place where students from all the branches of TBI can come for advanced studies. This is the place where we will learn how to bring the Gospel to the unreached people groups of Central Africa. This is a place to train church planters, Sunday School teachers, elders and deacons. This is where we will train our faculty for TBI.

Do you think this building is important? This week our TBI students are meeting in a tent in the middle of this building. We must do better.

What would it take to add a roof and ceiling and lights to our auditorium? We lack only \$9,000.

We all have needs. Please consider the importance of this need and the ongoing work of planting Bible Colleges in Africa. This work is important. The Apostle Paul asks us a series of questions in Romans 10:14-15: ¹⁴How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? ¹⁵And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: “How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!”
