**Dear Directors and Partners in the work of the Gospel,**

I look back over 2016 and I am filled with grateful joy. Christ has accomplished great and mighty things. God's grace brought many victories. **To Him be all the glory!**

## 2016

1. Trinity Biblical Institute continued to grow; our branches have spread throughout East Africa. We opened new branches of Trinity Biblical Institute in Juba, South Sudan, Endebess, Kenya, and Kasese, Western, Uganda. We also opened smaller works in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Burundi. We made contacts to open new branches of TBI in Rwanda and Tanzania.
2. We added to our African faculty with excellent results; now we can send out teams of African teachers to minister throughout East Africa.
3. Our headquarters in Kapchorwa, Uganda was completed and furnished; in addition, we were able to purchase additional land for further expansion.
4. A new radio building has been completed and Sidney Anderson plans to come with me in March so that we can extend coverage of our radio station into Eastern Uganda and Kenya.
5. We distributed school supplies to all the children in Grace Children's Center in Gulu and provided funds to complete a classroom building.
6. We began research regarding the accreditation of TBI.
7. Churches were started by our graduates, and so many other ministries have started we cannot track all of them
8. We have increased security at two of our Branches by adding armed guards. We ask you to pray for God's continued protection.
9. Funding has been provided to ship more than 1200 Christian books to Kampala, Uganda.
10. We developed solid partnerships with Third Millennium Ministries and the Gospel Coalition.
11. Through our mobile medical clinics, we treated about 1600 people at our Headquarters campus.
12. We completed plans for our new dormitories and auditorium in Kapchorwa, Uganda.
13. In Dahlonega, we continue to reach out and establish many contacts through our retreat center, The Well.

## 2017

**This is a new year in which we must build on the God-given blessings of the past, and faithfully go forward with focus and determination in order to complete our mission.** The focus of our teaching in TBI for the first six months will be on Gospel Transformation. This is designed to ground our students/disciples in the Gospel and to help them begin to see everything with eyes of grace.

1. Our greatest need is a large auditorium at our Headquarters for TBI classes and for special training for our best students. In the future, we will bring students to Kapchorwa, Uganda from war-torn areas in East Africa, so that they can have training. This facility will seat 500 students and cost

approximately \$80,000. Phase I of this projects includes a large water tank and the foundation at a cost of \$27,500.

2. As we travel into the interior of Africa, we need to purchase a large van for our faculty to arrive safely at their various teaching destinations.
3. In July, we plan to establish a new branch of TBI in Rwanda and strengthen all existing branches.
4. As we look forward to 2018, we will begin to plan and explore the needs in Tanzania for a branch of TBI.
5. We are collecting good theological books and plan to bring additional libraries to East Africa.
6. In March, we plan to install the Radio Station Link on Mount Elgon, allowing us to broadcast the Gospel into Kenya.
7. During the second quarter of TBI, we will begin to turn over most of the instruction in our older centers to our African Teachers. This will allow a second group of teachers to begin teaching in newer locations
8. As God provides, we will need to purchase land for our TBI branches in Endebess, Kenya, and Kasese, Uganda; we outgrew these two locations during the first meetings.
9. In Dahlonga, we are constructing a new entryway to the Well, which involves constructing a road about a mile long.
10. In February, we will be sending two of our coordinators, Charles Kwalia in Kenya, and Pastor Simiyu in South Sudan, to Westminster Christian Institute Uganda for additional training in the hopes that they will one day join our faculty.

As we continue to reach out, God seems to open more and more doors. We must begin to pray regarding regions beyond East Africa that need the Gospel and leadership training for Christ's church.

It is a privilege to be sent and to go into the world and share the Gospel. About a fourth of our budget is given in the last weeks of December.
